

The Village of Lakemore
Minutes for Council Meeting
July 17, 2017

Meeting Called to Order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Justice.

Opening Roll Call: Ms. Snyder, Mrs. Cochran, Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, Mr. Lance, and Mr. Timko were present.

Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Justice.

Motion to Accept Minutes of the Council Meeting on June 5, 2017, as presented and not read was made by Mr. Cole and seconded by Ms. Snyder. Roll call: Mrs. Cochran, Mr. Cole, Mr. Timko, and Ms. Snyder voted “yes”. Mrs. Coontz and Mr. Lance abstained. Motion carried.

Motion to Accept Minutes of the Council Meeting on July 3, 2017, as presented and not read was made by Mr. Cole and seconded by Mrs. Coontz. Roll call: Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, Mr. Lance, Ms. Snyder, and Mrs. Cochran voted “yes”. Mr. Timko abstained. Motion carried.

Motion to Accept Bills Presented by Fiscal Officer for \$154,494.80, as presented and not read was made by Mr. Timko and seconded by Mr. Cole. Roll call: Mr. Cole, Mr. Lance, Mr. Timko, Ms. Snyder, Mrs. Cochran, and Mrs. Coontz voted “yes”. Motion carried.

Motion to Accept June 2017 Bank Reconciliation Report as presented and not read was made by Mr. Lance and seconded by Mr. Timko. Roll call: Mr. Lance, Mr. Timko, Ms. Snyder, Mrs. Cochran, Mrs. Coontz, and Mr. Cole voted “yes”. Motion carried.

Mayor’s Report

Mayor Justice thanked Chief Ray and the police department for assisting with zoning, the removal of abandoned vehicles, and locating areas where line-of-sight is poor.

Mayor Justice announced Council will be on break the month of August.

Council Committee Reports

Mr. Lance thanked Summit County Public Health, Let's Grow Akron, and Summit ReWorks for funding the expansion of the community garden. A compost bin, sign, two benches, and more planting beds were added.

Mr. Cole announced Springfield Cares is holding a "stuff the bus" weekend July 28, 29, and 30 at the parking lot on Flickinger and Sanitarium to receive donations of school supplies and snacks.

Mr. Cole announced Lakemore United Methodist Church is having a free ice cream social and movie at Dodds Lakefront Park on Saturday, August 5th at 8:00 p.m.

Mr. Cole announced the Seventh Day Advent is providing free lunches to children and disabled adults Monday through Friday.

Ms. Snyder announced Springfield Cares is holding a backpack giveaway at the Lakemore Municipal Building on August 12th. The Lakemore Fire Department will be providing hot dogs.

Mrs. Cochran announced the next Council meetings will be Tuesday, September 5, 2017 and Monday, September 18th at 7:00 p.m.

Mrs. Cochran announced the next Council workshops will be September 13th and 26th at 6:00 p.m.

Appearing before Council:

Edward Bailey of 1606 Hilda Street reported the dead end of Elmer is in poor condition and causing damage to their vehicles. Mayor Justice suggested meeting with Gene Taylor to review the area and see what could be done.

Rosalita Polio of 2499 Church Street inquired if Church Street was scheduled for repairs. She also asked if there were plans to re-pave any roads. Mayor Justice explained there are no pavement plans for Church Street, but the Public Service Department will patch areas in August and September. Mayor Justice stated the Village has afforded re-paving areas the past two years. He also reminded the Village was just released from fiscal emergency; so funding was very limited. Mayor Justice did explain the Village has on the November ballot an issue to increase the local income tax by a quarter percent. These funds will be used for road improvements.

Old Business

Mr. Timko made a motion to adopt Ordinance 1590-2017. Mr. Lance seconded the motion. Mayor Justice explained this legislation provides the ability to enforce better sanitary sewer regulations for anyone disposing of fats, oils, and grease. Roll call: Mr. Timko, Ms. Snyder, Mrs. Cochran, Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, and Mr. Lance voted "yes". Ordinance adopted.

New Business

Mr. Lance made a motion to dispense with the three readings of Resolution 6728-2017. Mrs. Coontz seconded the motion. Roll call: Ms. Snyder, Mrs. Cochran, Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, Mr. Lance, and Mr. Timko voted "yes". Motion carried.

Mr. Lance made a motion to adopt Resolution 6728-2017. Mr. Cole seconded the motion. Roll call: Mrs. Cochran, Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, Mr. Lance, Mr. Timko, and Ms. Snyder voted "yes". Resolution adopted.

Mr. Cole made a motion to dispense with the three readings of Resolution 6729-2017. Mr. Timko seconded the motion. Roll call: Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, Mr. Lance, Mr. Timko, Ms. Snyder, and Mrs. Cochran voted “yes”. Motion carried.

Mr. Cole made a motion to adopt Resolution 6729-2017. Mr. Timko seconded the motion. Roll call: Mr. Cole, Mr. Timko, Ms. Snyder, Mrs. Cochran, and Mrs. Coontz voted “yes”. Mr. Lance abstained. Resolution adopted.

Mrs. Cochran made a motion to dispense with the three readings of Resolution 6730-2017. Mr. Cole seconded the motion. Roll call: Mr. Timko, Ms. Snyder, Mrs. Cochran, Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, and Mr. Lance voted “yes”. Motion carried.

Mr. Cole stated he has known Mr. Ganska for a long time, as he is a teacher for SuperLearning Center. He believes Mr. Ganska will be a wonderful addition to the police department.

Mrs. Cochran made a motion to adopt Resolution 6730-2017. Mr. Cole seconded the motion. Roll call: Ms. Snyder, Mrs. Cochran, Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, Mr. Lance, and Mr. Timko voted “yes”. Resolution adopted.

Motion for Adjournment was made by Mr. Timko and seconded by Mr. Cole. Roll call: Mrs. Cochran, Mrs. Coontz, Mr. Cole, Mr. Lance, Mr. Timko, and Ms. Snyder voted “yes”. Meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
